We support our graduates post-program through continued coaching, gatherings, advisory services, and advocacy initiatives.

## **OUR PROGRAMS**

We design and provide high-quality programs to support, educate, and inspire entrepreneurs of all backgrounds with entrepreneurship and business fundamentals.

#### Collab Office Hours

Office Hours provide Connecticut leaders and entrepreneurs with a chance to deep dive 1-on-1 with Collab staff into themselves and their venture. Sessions are 30 minutes, conducted in-person or over the phone, and open to anyone in Connecticut.

#### **Groundwork: The Pre-Accelerator**

Started in partnership with New Haven Healthy Start, the Collab Pre-Accelerator is a part-time, 5-week program for entrepreneurs that provides support on idea identification, organization and communication skills, and marketing.

#### Accelerator

Our Collab Accelerator is our core program for entrepreneurs. It is an intensive, part-time, 12-week program for a cohort of entrepreneurs ready for our deepest level of support.

#### Neighborhood Pop-Up Coaching

We partnered with organizations to do neighborhood pop-up coaching events to meet entrepreneurs exactly where they are. Some of our locations included at Junta's COVID-19 vaccine clinic and CitySeed's Downtown Farmers' Market.

#### Supporting Creative Entrepreneurs

In partnership with the City of New Haven Department of Cultural Affairs, we launched "Entrepreneurship Decoded" a program focused on BIPOC arts and creative entrepreneurs.

#### Collab for Next Generation Entrepreneurs

With an award from the United Way for Greater New Haven, we were able to launch programs for New Haven Public School highschool students. Our partners included District Arts & Education and High School in the Community.

# GRADUATE MILESTONES

- >> Two Black-led venture graduates (Flayvers LLC and Fruit of Thee Earth purchased and are revonating their own food trucks.
- Many graduates received distinguished awards: Oh Shito! received Comcast RISE Creative Production Award, Havenly won the Greater New Haven Chamber of Commerce Nonprofit Resource Council's Constellations Award, The Huneebee Project received the Morris and Irmgard Wessell Fund Unsung Heroes Award, and three graduates (Vegan Ahava, Opal Stork Home Care, Threads By Tea) received the ConnCORP Economic Justice Fund award.
- >> The Notorious P.I.C. (photo credit New Haven Arts Paper), purchased and is revonating a double-decker bus that will be a mobile photography studio and event space.
- >> **Push To Start**, a program that supports youth in skateboarding and the creative arts, led on building a temporary skatepark located in New Haven.
- Multiple graduates opened spaces: Kawit! opened a ghost kitchen a church in Wooster Square, Extra Yard opened a gym, and Threads By Tea opened a design studio.
