The past year at Collab has been a transformative one and I couldn't be more proud of our staff, community, funders, and other partners that made it happen. Collab continues to grow and develop new ways to support the entrepreneurs we serve as well as the larger New Haven entrepreneurial ecosystem.

We took the first steps in implementing our strategy to develop strong infrastructure to support organizational growth and to add programming to address the barriers faced by the entrepreneurs we serve. Those steps included bringing on the organization's first Executive Director, hiring a new Accelerator Programs Manager, and hiring a new Administrative Services Specialist.

In response to funder and entrepreneur feedback as well as historical data, we launched two new programs — the Collab Women's Initiative and the Collab Funding Intensive pilot to provide additional support to women entrepreneurs and to ensure Collab entrepreneurs are prepared to access investment funding.

We were thrilled to be recognized for our work in the community this year as recipients of the Elm City Freddy Fixer "Uplifting Our Community" Award. In addition, I was awarded the "Advocacy Award" from the Quinnipiac Chamber of Commerce. These recognitions not only affirm the work we're doing in the community, they demonstrate impact and tell us to stay in the fight.

As you read through the rest of the report, you will learn about some of the wins and successes of our amazing graduates as they continue to build thriving businesses in New Haven and beyond. In 2022, many Collab entrepreneur graduates reached major milestones in their growth.

Oh Shito!, founded by Kwame Asare and his family, is a Ghanian hot sauce company. Not only is Oh Shito! sauce placed in multiple Stop & Shop and other grocery store locations, but they received the CTNext Food Innovation LaunchPad's top prize of \$10,000.

Threads By Tea, founded by Tea Montgomery, is a bespoke wearable art company. We are thrilled that Tea received the prestigious Arts Council for Greater New Haven Arts Award this year.

Venezia Pizza, founded by the Torres family, is a pizza restaurant and venture. After running a Mexican cuisine food truck in 2022, they launched their restaurant location in North Haven!

Tortillería Semilla New Haven, cofounded by Ariana Shapiro, Elizabeth Gonzalez, Anabel Hernandez, Martina Perez, and Javier Gonzalez-Villatoro, launched a cooperative tortillería selling handmade tortillas.
